AMAZING BOOK ADVENTURES (Instructor: Mrs. C. Halle) (Room 11)

Grades K - 2

Maximum 12 per class

Fee: \$3.00

If you like to read or listen to stories and do crafts and other activities, then join me in the class! We will read and listen to some favorite books and then have fun doing activities relating to those stories. We will create art projects, make tasty treats, play games, and do other fun and exciting activities.

BOOKIN' AND COOKIN' (Instructor: Ms. C. Mashin) (Room 6)

Grades K - 2

Maximum 12 per class

Fee: \$10.00

Join the fun as we make books come to life by creating story time snacks! Each day, students will listen to a book and use the story or the characters as inspiration to create their own simple snack. Popular book characters such as Pete the Cat, Froggy, the Pigeon, and Curious George will influence the tasty treats that we that we will enjoy together!

BOWLING FOR THE CHAMPS! (Instructor: Mr. T. Parnitzke) (Room 9)

Grades 2 - 4

Maximum 25 per class

Fee: \$35.00

The class will emphasize fun, development of various bowling techniques, an understanding of basic bowling etiquette, and a lifetime appreciation of the great sport of bowling. In addition to bowling fundamentals, a tournament with prizes will be held at the end of the four weeks. **Students need to have enough strength to hold and roll the ball in a traditional manner.** Students will meet at Northview and are walked to JB's Entertainment Center and back.

BUILDING READING AND MATH MUSCLES (Mrs. S. Demmon) (Room 12)

Grade 2

Maximum 3 per class

Join us for a fun class that will continue the skills learned in first grade reading and math. We will divide the class time into three parts: reading, math, and active play. **BY TEACHER RECOMMENDATION ONLY.**

CAMP TIGER (Instructor: Mrs. K. Myszewski) (Room 3)

Grades 1 - 4

Maximum 15 per class

Fee: \$8.00

Please join us in a fun morning of exercising our minds and bodies. A morning at Camp Tiger will include math exploration, scientifically enhanced reading, arts and crafts, cooking and camp games. This class is scheduled from 8:00 - 11:00; however, arrangements can be made to allow students to take swimming. **BY TEACHER RECOMMENDATION ONLY.**

CIRCLE 'ROUND THE KITCHEN (Instructor: Mrs. S. Vogel) (Lunch Room)

Grades 1 - 4

Maximum 12-14 per class

Fee: \$23.00

Circle 'Round the Kitchen to read recipes and to get help with measuring techniques. Get a chance to set the table, stir (guided), cut (guided), and use table manners while eating. The goal is to be able to prepare **breakfast** recipes like: Egyptian Eyes, Buttermilk Pancakes, Chocolate Quickie Stickies, and Orange Julius. We'll work on techniques for making **lunch** recipes like: Homemade Pasta, Homemade Pizza, Fruit Pizza, and Shake n' Bake Potatoes. And who could resist creating and eating **desserts** like: S'mores on a Stick, Chocolate Poodles, Carmel Puff Popcorn, and Monster Cookies. There will be time for creating an **appetizer** like: Chocolate Fondue, Oyster Cracker Snack, Green Meanies, Banana Smoothie Pops and Dipper's Dip. DRUMMING FOR MALAWI (Instructor: Ms. C. Demmon) (Room 31)

Grades 3 – 4

Maximum 15 per class

Fee: \$5.00

Help out our teacher friends in Malawi and learn more about their culture through something we all have in common – the language of music! Students will learn to take advantage of personal connections to Malawi and Ghana, Africa to enhance their authentic world drumming skills. The class will learn how to improvise, compose, and drum as a group.

ELEMENTARY MATH (Instructor: Miss C. Dekanich) (Room 2)

Grades 1 - 4

Maximum 12 per class

In this class students will get to explore and build their math skills by solving story problems, improving number sense, playing games, and using lots of manipulatives. We will focus on improving math skills by playing lots of games, including games that students can play at home too! We will also get to use technology to build math skills through online math games and programs that can also be accessed at home. **BY TEACHER RECOMMENDATION ONLY.**

Grades 1 - 4

Maximum 12 per class

The elementary reading summer school program is designed to maintain reading skills in the areas of comprehension, decoding, and fluency. Small-group work done in class will reinforce the skills and goals children have worked on throughout the school year. **BY TEACHER RECOMMENDATION ONLY.**

FUN IN THE SUN (Instructor: Mrs. B. Kneser) (Northview Gym)

Grades K - 2

Maximum 20 per class

Fun and sun go together in this class! We will help you improve fitness, develop basic skills and special awareness, AND improve your fitness. We will focus on a variety of games and activities to kick start your summer!

INTERMEDIATE READING (Instructor: Mrs. S. Demmon) (Room 10)

Grades 4 – 5

Maximum 10 per class

We're on a roll – so let's keep rolling! The students in the intervention groups read a lot of new books this year, and keeping that momentum going is important as they move into fourth grade. Let's get ready to make their last year at Northview their best one ever! This class will advance the student's reading, with a special focus on comprehension and fluency. We will be reading both fiction and non-fiction books, and there will be something for everyone to love about the books we read!! **BY TEACHER RECOMMENDATION ONLY.**

LET'S MAKE MOVIE MUSIC (Instructor: Ms. C. Demmon) (Room 31)

Grades 2 - 4

Maximum 15 per class

Fee: \$5.00

Ever notice the music or sound effects while watching your favorite movie? Ever wonder what it would be like to be the musician who composes and performs while the movie is happening in real time? Students in this class will learn how music can make or break a movie – even totally change the meaning behind a scene. This class will compose their very own music for Mrs. Demmon's "Let's Put on a Play" class and perform their creation on instruments in real time during a performance on the final day!

LET'S PUT ON A PLAY (Instructor: Mrs. S. Demmon) (Room 10)

Grades 2 – 4

Maximum 12-15 per class

Fee: \$6.00

Calling all budding actors...writers...directors...costume and prop designers! Join us in a fabulous experience of not just being in a play, but helping to create it from the very beginning. Students will learn all about what it takes to put on a show, from giving input into a script centered around a provided theme, to learning about "blocking" (where the actors move on the stage), and all the other things that happen "behind the scenes". The class will end with a proud performance for family members and other honored guests! NOTE: Due to the nature of this class, it is crucial that only those students able to attend every class sign up. One absence will be allowed, except for the final week of dress rehearsals and the performance. The performance will be on the last day of summer school. Students will be asked to bring a white/light-colored, plain t-shirt to decorate for costumes (could be new or used).

MUSICAL STORYTELLING (Instructor: Ms. C. Demmon) (Room 31)

Grades K - 3

Maximum 20 per class

Explore, act out, dance, and play instruments and games as you experience the musical characters from stories such as *Peter and the Wolf*, *Carnival of the Animals*, *Miss Mary Mack*, *Brown Bear Brown Bear*, *Over in the Meadow*, and more! Students will learn how instruments can represent different characters. The class will have the chance to play games, sing, and play instruments while hearing a variety of musical stories.

OOEY GOOEY SCIENCE (Instructor: Mrs. N. Jacques) (Room 5)

Grades 1 - 4

Maximum 12 per class

Fee: \$3.00

Do you like science? Do you like to get messy or do experiments? Then get ready to do Ooey Gooey Science! Each day we will learn by creating fun science projects like baking soda volcanoes, slime, cloud dough, oreo moons, and crystals. Hands-on projects will help students learn about science topics like volcanoes, clouds, plants, solids and liquids, and space.

SELECT SPROUTS (Instructor: Mrs. K. Sheahan) (Room 1)

Grade 1

Maximum 7 per class

Select Sprouts is an opportunity for your child to maintain and/or improve his/her reading and writing skills in a small group setting during the summer months. Engaging reading and writing activities will be specifically designed to meet the individual needs of your young learner so that he/she is more prepared to meet the demands of first grade when entering school in the fall. TINY TIGER HOOPS (Instructor: Mrs. A. Parnitzke) (Room 9)

Grades 1-4

Maximum 15

Come and enjoy a summer of basketball!!! Through games, contests, and drills, you will have the opportunity to develop and improve your basketball skills!

This course is designed to introduce students to the game of basketball. The class format appropriately scales down all aspects of regulations basketball – including using smaller basketballs, shortening the court dimensions, so that the game becomes specifically tailored to student's age.

The emphasis of the course is to introduce the various skills of basketball such as: dribbling, passing, and proper shooting techniques. A very important aspect that will be stressed throughout the course is sportsmanship and teamwork. Many skills will be introduced by using movements and activities that are age appropriate. The class will be held at Northview.
